208, Teacher's Guide	#19 Explanation	19. (A) <i>Reading/Humanities/Development</i> CCRS: AVG.VO.2; CC: ELA-Literacy.CCRA.R.1 This is a development question. The use of "claimed" and "allegedly" make a big difference in how the supposed loss of the manuscript in a fire should be interpreted. The author uses those words to indicate that the claim is doubtful. Both (A) and (B) provide possible correct answers, but the best answer is (A), because in the last paragraph the author states that the most likely explanation is "unreliability of human memory."
